DEFINITIONS:

Small Business Concern: Under the criteria and size standards in 13 CFR 121 (usually less than 500 employees)

Small Disadvantaged Business Concern (FAR 52.219-8): A small business concern that has received certification as a small disadvantaged business concern consistent with 13 CFR part 124 and that is at least 51% unconditionally owned and operated by Black Americans, Hispanic Americans, Native Americans, Asian-Pacific Americans, Subcontinent Asian Americans, Indian Tribes, and Native Hawaiian Organizations.

Women-Owned Small Business Concern (FAR 52.219-8): Small business concern that is at least 51% owned and controlled by one or more women.

HUBZone Small Business Concern (FAR 52.219-8): Historically underutilized business zone, which is an area located within one or more qualified census tracts, qualified nonmetropolitan counties, or lands within the external boundaries of an Indian reservation.

Veteran-Owned Small Business Concern (FAR 52.219-8): Small business concern not less than 51% of which is owned and controlled by one or more veterans.

Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Business Concern (FAR 52.219-8): Small business concern not less than 51% of which is owned and controlled by one or more service-disabled veterans.

Indian-Owned Economic Enterprise (FAR 52.226-1): Indian-owned commercial, industrial or business activity established or organized for the purpose of profit, provided that Indian ownership constitutes not less than 51% of the enterprise.

Historically Black College or Minority Institution (FAR 52.226-2): An institution determined by the Secretary of Education to meet requirements of 34 CFR Section 608.2. For DOD, NASA and Cost Guard, this term also includes any nonprofit research institution that was an integral part of such a college or university before November 14, 1986.

Foreign Business (22 CFR 120, 16): Any foreign corporation, business association, partnership, trust, society, or any other entity or group that is not incorporated or organized to do business in the United States, as well as international organizations, foreign governments, or any agency or subdivision of foreign governments (e.g., diplomatic missions). It also includes any natural person who is not a lawful, permanent resident as defined by 8 U.S.C. 1101(a)(20) or who is not a protected individual as defined by 8 U.S.C. 1324(a)(3).

U.S. Business with Foreign Affiliates or Operations (22 CFR 120.15 15 U.S.C.A. 80a-2): US businesses are defined as any Corporation, business association, partnership, society, trust, or other entity organization or group that is incorporated to do business in the United States, including any Governmental (federal, state or local) entities, and natural persons who are lawful permanent residents as defined by 8 U.S.C. 1101(a)(20) or protected individuals as defined by 8 U.S.C. 1324(a)(3). Foreign affiliates or operations are defined as Foreign business (see above) which are related to the U.S. Business where one business effectively controls the other as either a parent or subsidiary, characterized by identity of ownership of capital stock. It also includes facilities of U.S. Businesses that are located outside the geographic boundaries of the United States.

Under 15 U.S.C. 645(d), any person who misrepresents a firm's status as a small disadvantaged business concern in order to obtain a contract to be awarded under the preference programs established pursuant to sections 8(a), 8(d), 9 or 15 of the Small Business Act or any other provision of Federal Law that specifically references section 8(d) for a definition of program eligibility, shall-

- (I) Be punished by imposition of fine, imprisonment or both;
- (II) Be subject to administrative remedies, including suspension and debarment; and
- (III) Be ineligible for participation in programs conducted under that authority of the Act.
